Anita's Italian Goats Cheese Frittata

Firstly, a big welcome to our new editor Amanda. I'm sure many Jindivickians know that Amanda breeds the sweetest looking goats you've ever seen. In honour of her appointment, I've come up with a recipe for a goats cheese frittata. I hope you'll all enjoy this......I'm sure Amanda will.

- 1 medium red onion-finely sliced
- 1 medium red capsicum-finely diced
- 4 silver beet leaves, green only finely sliced

2 tablespoon of olive oil 8 eggs - beaten 40 g. grated pecorino or parmesan cheese Big handful of cherry tomatoes halved

Big handful of



pitted black olives - whole

3 cubes of Meredith Goat's Cheese from jar- broken into chunks

2 or more tablespoons of roughly chopped parsley. Salt and pepper

Preheat oven to 220c. In a 20 cm overproof dish or cast iron pan, gently

warm oil. Add onion, capsicum and a pinch of salt and slowly cook untiln soft but not coloured, about 10 minutes. Add silverbeet and cook until just wilted. Beat eggs, add pecorino cheese and salt and pepper. Whisk again. Pour over vegetables and with a fork, gently incorporate vegetable and egg mix just a little. Scatter on top, tomatoes, chunks of goats cheese, olives and parsley. Bake in hot oven for 15 minutes or until golden and set.

Leave it to cool for 5 minutes before serving. Serves 4
