Miriam Rosalie Snoxall (Ray) was born 19th Juy 1939. She was one of 4 children. She had one older brother and 2 older sisters. Nana was the daughter of Stella and Bernard Ray, who lived in Kenya, Africa. Nanas sisters preferred the name Rosalie – so that is what people called her.

In 1958, Nana was married to Philip Snoxall in Namirembe Cathedral in Uganda. They migrated to Australia in 1964 with 3 small children – Andre, Nicola and Gavin. They had 2 more children – Clio and Noel born in Australia.

All her life she has been extremely interested in flowers and plants, in particular roses, because there are literally hundreds of different kinds. Nana has built a magnificent garden at Jindivick – it is so special that people come to see it in bus loads.

Nana also likes monkeys and she had a pet monkey when she was a girl, she called it Jackie. Jackie was black and white and nana had him until he went to the zoo. Whenever nana would leave fresh bread out on the table ready for dinner, he would climb onto the table and grab the bread and eat it!

Nana grows all sorts of food in her veggie patch and she has an orchard for all her berries to grow. With all the foods she grows she makes marmalade, jams, mayonnaise and my favourite rhubarb lemonade!

Nana is fantastic at art. She makes stained glass windows, knit wear and crochets lots of things. Nana is helpful and kind. She likes cooking, arty stuff and gardening. Nana is a lovely person and I feel special around her. (Ella Snoxall)

At writing Group, sitting around your dining table, gazing through your magnificent stained glass.


Scenes of Africa, the Australian magpie, your immaculate garden to Baw Baw, the view, world class.

You shared and showed us, enriching our lives, Rosalie. May you rest in peace.








Spring in Rosalie's beautiful Garden.

An interesting area to investigate, before the tracks reopen to vehicles, is Robinsons Creek Track the views along the top of the logging coupe are fantastic. This can be done either the full length from the Bullock link extension (out Stolls Rd) down to Forest Rd Labertouche drop off and pickup are best for this. Or if you prefer a return loop Robinsons Creek Track to Tin Mine Track, and back Bullock Link Track (quite challenging) You can Park at the Caves Rd.
