300 metres south of Bloomfield Rd on the Nerrim South rd you can pull in on the East side of the road on a track immediately before the metal safety



railing. We had eight vehicles in there recently on the side of the 4WD track. If you walk south about 100m then follow the track heading off to your right going down. Near the creek there are remnants of old mine shafts and people have been panning the creek. On the way back up the hill near the top take the left turn and go along further then back down not past the fence line, in a 'H" there is a terrific termite mound shaped like a ghost and if you continue straight up you will be back at your car. The other side of the road has much longer tracks and a hut, that will appear in another newsletter. About 3km with hills. *No facilities.*
