
Local Bush Walks.

Lawson Falls and Discovery Walking Tracks. Travel out Forest Rd Labertouche into the Bunyip State Park. The road has been recently graded and re-stoned, so is in good order. Just before the intersection of Forest and Teatree Roads is the entry to the carpark and picnic area, with toilet block. The walk is lovely and the falls give the impression of seclusion within a pretty little valley. The walk is 1.3km each way with a couple of small hills but with a steeper stepped decent to the falls. Discovery walking trail will take you on a longer more challenging walk towards Gentle Annie and return via a loop of about 5km.

I did this walk yesterday and came across a tiger snake, a male lyrebird and a wallaby whilst walking, and

another wallaby and two lace monitors whilst driving on Forest Rd.

No dogs are allowed, as it is State Park, and please take your rubbish home.
